Kindergarten Supply List  
2018-2019 School Year

- Backpack (needs to be full size)
- 12 Ticonderoga pencils, *marked with child's name*
- 2 packages of 8 Crayola fat washable markers, *marked with child's name (one package will be all used up by Christmas)*
- 2 packages of 8 Crayola skinny washable markers, *marked with child's name (one package will be all used up by Christmas)*
- 1 package **fine tip** dry erase markers, *marked with child's name*
- Whiteboard eraser (an old sock or glove is fine), *marked with child's name*
- Watercolor paints with brush, *marked with child's name*
- 1 three ring binder, for Kindergarten Portfolio, *marked with child's name*
- 3 plastic folders, *marked with child's name*
- paint shirt, *marked with child's name*
- One complete change of clothes, including underwear, *in Ziploc bag, marked with child's name*
- 1 box dixie cups
- 200 paper napkins
- 8 rolls paper towels
- 1 ream copy paper (500 pages or more)

Choose ONE of the following list, to be put into the shared bins:

- Crayola\* Crayons, set of 64 or more
- Crayola\* Colored Pencils, set of 36 or more
- Crayola\* Washable Markers, set of 20 or more (fat or skinny)

*\*Crayola is actually enough better quality that it is worth getting instead of CrazyArt or other off brands.*

**How to mark small items...** In my observation, the marking technique that lasts the longest is to write on the pencil or marker with sharpie, then cover the writing with a piece of packing tape.
